Preservation and Programing Sharing the Shaker Legacy



Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill recently completed a large-scale preservation project in the Spiritual Center of the Village. While the buildings have an immediate impact on visitors the artifacts, images, documents and interpretative materials help bring the buildings and the Shakers to life.

A great example of how preservation work and programming go hand-in-hand in sharing the Shaker legacy and Shaker story

is the Music Program that occurs twice daily in the 1820 Meeting House. The Meeting House was used by the Shakers as a gathering place for community worship. Music and dance were primary and integral parts of their worship activities, and the Meeting House

was specifically designed with this in mind The program tells the spiritual story of the Shakers and illustrates the stunning engineering of the building in a way that leaves our visitors awestruck.

Our goal is to provide a guest experience across the historic site that inspires our guests through stories, activities and exhibits that connect to Shaker heritage and American history. They also engage visitors in the political climate, cultural shifts and economic trends through the 19th and early 20th Century, and how those compare to modern times.

Shaker Village is Kentucky's largest National Historic Landmark. With 34 historic structures and three-thousand acres, the village is a crown jewel of Kentucky. As a non-profit organization, Shaker Village depends on charitable support, guest revenue and an endowment to sustain this powerful place by sharing the legacy of the Pleasant Hill Shakers for of Trustees of Shaker Village launched an ambitious \$25 million campaign to raise much needed funds for preservation, education and conservation for our unique cultural treasure. To date, the Village has raised over \$13.1 million and completed preservation projects including the iconic 1824 Centre Family Dwelling, the 1820 Meeting House and new Welcome Center in the 1815 Carpenters' Shop. Funding for these three projects was provided in part by the Lilly Endowment, Inc. and the James Graham Brown Foundation.

This year preservation projects have included the 1833 Water House, the 1860 Bath House, the 1821 Ministry's Workshop and 1811 Old Stone Shop. It is exciting to see preservation at work with new rooftops and enhanced programming for guests but there is still much work to do.
