



## K-5 Grade Student Experiences The Preserve

- *Fees: \$8 per student/chaperone for 1st program, \$5 per student/chaperone for each additional program.*

**Prairie Ecosystem Hike** – Welcome to one of North America's rarest ecosystems – a restored native prairie. We'll use all of our senses to explore the many plants and animals that call this place home, discovering how they fit together into a diverse ecosystem.

**Shaker Footprints: The Lost Village** – Walk in the footprints of the Shakers and discover what history is hidden in plain sight! We'll learn how to "read" Pleasant Hill's natural and archaeological landscape, and in the process, learn to understand the processes that continually shape our world.

**Movers & Shakers** – Express yourself! During this exploratory program, students will learn about self-expression through creative movement and dance. Join us as we connect personal experiences with one of the key communal practices of the Shakers.

**If Walls Could Talk** – What can we learn about people by looking at where they live, work, or worship? We'll use our observation and inquiry skills to reveal the secrets of Shaker architecture and design – and, in turn, Shaker lives.

**History Detectives** – How do we know what *really* happened in history? Just like a good mystery, people of the past leave behind many “clues”! We’ll follow a trail of evidence, comparing what the Shakers made, used, wrote, drew, or photographed. Get out your magnifying glass and let’s uncover history’s secrets!

**The Amazing Life of Dirt** – What's the difference between "dirt" and "soil"? To investigate, we'll get our hands dirty experimenting with soil samples up-close and discover how the rich ground beneath us impacts our everyday lives.

**Soil Scientists** – Explore how current farming practices at Pleasant Hill reflect the legacy of the Shakers and our mission of thoughtful land stewardship. Learn the basics of regenerative and sustainable agriculture and test soil health through a series of experiments.

**agriCULTURE: From Land to Community** – How did Pleasant Hill grow into a thriving and successful community in nineteenth-century rural Kentucky? We’ll explore how the Shakers used agriculture to fulfill their vision of “heaven on earth” and how agriculture is still the foundation of modern communities today.

**agriCULTURE: Connecting Communities** – Did you know that you could buy Pleasant Hill products in faraway states like Texas and Louisiana in the 1800s? We’ll use the Shakers’ innovative agricultural practices, savvy marketing techniques, and keen business skills as a case study to explore the many ways that agricultural industries still connect the world today.

**Shaker Life** – Explore Pleasant Hill’s buildings and get hands-on with objects as we uncover the beliefs, practices, and innovations central to the Shakers’ unique way of life. How did the Shakers’ beliefs shape their community? What parallels can we draw between the Shakers and our contemporary lives?
